PRIVACY POLICY

Delta Running Project (or hereafter 'DRP' or the 'Club') respects the privacy of visitors to its websites. As a result, we have developed this website privacy policy. This website privacy policy applies only to the operation of websites owned by DRP.

PRIVACY NOTICE

What personal data we hold on you

You may give us information about you by filling in forms at an event or online, or by corresponding with us by phone, e-mail or otherwise. This includes information you provide when you register with the Club. The information you give us may include your name, date of birth, address, e-mail address, phone number.

Reasons we may need to process your data include:

To Deal with enquiries made by you by email or through the contact form

For training and competition entry

- sharing personal data with DRP coaches to administer training sessions;
- sharing personal data to enter events;
- sharing personal data with facility providers to manage access to the track; and
- sharing personal data with competition providers for entry in events.

For funding and reporting purposes

- analysing anonymised data to monitor club trends; and
- sending an annual club survey to improve your experience as a club member

For membership and club management

- processing of membership forms and payments;
- sharing data with committee members to provide information about club activities, membership renewals or invitation to social events;
- promoting club activity; and

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- publishing of race and competition results

On occasion we may collect personal data from non-members, for example in relation to the DRP running program. This information will be stored for 1 month or the duration of the activity it relates to and then destroyed securely. Our lawful basis for processing data is consent. Therefore, we will also need explicit consent from non-members to process this data, which we will ask for at the point of collecting it.

Who we share your personal data with

The Club does not supply any personal data to any third party other than, from time to time, for training and competition entry; for reporting, membership and club management purposes listed previously.

We will hold your personal data on file for as long as you are a member with us. Athlete data is updated every year, you will be invited to update details electronically. Any personal data we hold on you will be securely destroyed after five years of inactivity on that member's account. Your data is not processed for any further purposes other than those detailed in this policy.

Your rights regarding your personal data

As a data subject you may have the right at any time to request access to, rectification or erasure of your personal data; to restrict or object to certain kinds of processing of your personal data, including direct marketing; to the portability of your personal data and to complain to the relevant data protection supervisory authority about the processing of your personal data.

As a data subject you are not obliged to share your personal data with the Club. If you choose not to share your personal data with us we may not be able to register or administer your membership.

WEBSITE PRIVACY POLICY

We are committed to safeguarding the privacy of our website visitors; this policy sets out how we will treat your personal information.

1. What information do we collect?

We may collect, store and use the following kinds of personal data:

- (a) information about your computer and about your visits to and use of this website (including your IP address, geographical location, browser type, referral source, length of visit and number of page views)
- (b) information relating to any transactions carried out between you and us on or in relation to this website, including information relating to any purchases you make of our goods or services
- (c) information that you provide to us for the purpose of registering with us
- (d) information that you provide to us for the purpose of subscribing to our website services, email notifications

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and/or newsletters

(e) any other information that you choose to send to us

2. Cookies

A cookie consists of information sent by a web server to a web browser, and stored by the browser. The information is then sent back to the server each time the browser requests a page from the server. This enables the web server to identify and track the web browser.

We may use both “session” cookies and “persistent” cookies on the website. We will use the session cookies to keep track of you whilst you navigate the website. We will use the persistent cookies to enable our website to recognise you when you visit

Session cookies will be deleted from your computer when you close your browser. Persistent cookies will remain stored on your computer until deleted, or until they reach a specified expiry date.

Most browsers allow you to reject all cookies, whilst some browsers allow you to reject just third party cookies. For example, in Internet Explorer you can refuse all cookies by clicking “Tools”, “Internet Options”, “Privacy”, and selecting “Block all cookies” using the sliding selector. Blocking all cookies will, however, have a negative impact upon the usability of many websites

3. Using your personal data

Personal data submitted on this website will be used for the purposes specified in this privacy policy or in relevant parts of the website.

We will not without your express consent provide your personal information to any third parties for the purpose of direct marketing.

Disclosures

We may disclose information about you to any of our employees, officers, agents, suppliers or subcontractors insofar as reasonably necessary for the purposes as set out in this privacy policy.

In addition, we may disclose information about you:

- (a) to the extent that we are required to do so by law;
- (b) in connection with any legal proceedings or prospective legal proceedings;
- (c) in order to establish, exercise or defend our legal rights (including providing information to others for the

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purposes of fraud prevention and reducing credit risk); and

Except as provided in this privacy policy, we will not provide your information to third parties.

4. Security of your personal data

We will take reasonable technical and organisational precautions to prevent the loss, misuse or alteration of your personal information.

Of course, data transmission over the internet is inherently insecure, and we cannot guarantee the security of data sent over the internet.

5. Policy amendments

We may update this privacy policy from time-to-time by posting a new version on our website. You should check this page occasionally to ensure you are happy with any changes.

6. Your rights

You may instruct us to provide you with any personal information we hold about you. Provision of such information is usually free.

You may instruct us not to process your personal data for marketing purposes by email at any time. (In practice, you will usually either expressly agree in advance to our use of your personal data for marketing purposes, or we will provide you with an opportunity to opt-out of the use of your personal data for marketing purposes.)

7. Third party websites

The website contains links to other websites. We are not responsible for the privacy policies or practices of third party websites.

8. Updating information

Please let us know if the personal information which we hold about you needs to be corrected or updated.
